# Curriculum and support

All children at Bracken Lane are taught in line with the early years' framework (nursery and reception) and the English national curriculum (years 1 to 6). Pupils develop a solid base of core learning and are given opportunities to access a wide range of subjects to inspire and engage young minds.

Lessons at the academy are exciting and motivating, yet challenging and focused on building the key skills that will help pupils to be successful throughout the rest of their lives.

Our focus is on providing an inspiring and creative curriculum for each child, where pupils are encouraged to build on positive experiences, embrace challenge and be proud of their achievements – within a culture of very high expectations. As part of this learning culture, homework has an important part to play, and we expect and encourage parents and carers to fully support our homework policy.



## A day at the academy

Our academy starts at 9am with four classroom-based lessons during the day. There is a morning break and a staggered lunchtime to ensure all pupils can eat in comfort and with friends from their year group. The day ends at 3.30pm when parents and carers can collect their children from the academy.

9am	Academy day begins The doors open at 8.50am, when the children come into the academy building. Registration takes place at 9am.
12-1pm	Lunchtime All children get an hour for lunch. Children can either bring a healthy packed lunch or choose from our academy meals — these are prepared on site and paid for in advance. Dinners are provided free of charge for children in reception, year 1 and year 2.
	A wide range of playground games are played during lunchtimes, and our staff oversee these activities to ensure all children are safe and happy.
3.30pm	End of the academy day Staff see out pupils at the end of the day, unless children are attending one of our wide range of after-school clubs.



#### Breakfast club

Breakfast club\* runs from 7.30am until the beginning of the academy day. During this time children have the opportunity to participate in a variety of activities, as well as enjoy a healthy and varied breakfast.

Breakfast club is staffed by members of the Bracken Lane team and provides a consistent and calm start to the academy day.

#### After-school club

After-school club\* runs every day from 3.30-6pm. Children are offered a healthy snack, which is included in the cost.

#### Enrichment
